





2020 All-State Guest Conductors

Small School Band – Ingrid Larragoity-Martin



Dr. Ingrid Larragoity-Martin is the Director of Bands for the Visual & Performing Arts Academy at Skyline High School in Longmont, Colorado. Dr. LM, as her students affectionately call her, directs the Concert Band, Symphonic Band, Percussion Ensemble, Jazz Band, and Pep Band. Dr. Larragoity-Martin received a Bachelor of Music Education as well as a double master's degrees in music education and Conducting, all from the University of South Florida

After teaching high school band and orchestra in South Florida for ten years, Dr. LM decided to pursue her doctoral degree in Instrumental Conducting at the University of Colorado at Boulder, under distinguished Professor Allan McMurray. During her tenure at CU, she was active in the new music community conducting several premieres for the Pendulum New Music Concert series and CU Wind Ensemble.

Dr. Larragoity-Martin has served as Associate Director of Bands and Music Education Coordinator at Henderson State University as well as Associate Director of Bands at New Mexico State University. She continues to keep an active guest conductor, adjudicator, and clinician schedule with concert bands, marching bands, and orchestras. Dr. Larragoity-Martin has conducted in California, Arizona, Florida, Connecticut, New York, Georgia, Louisiana, Illinois, Texas, New Mexico, Colorado, as well as throughout Europe, Mexico, and China

Concert Band – Emily A. Moss

Dr. Emily A. Moss is the Director of Bands and Chair of the Department of Music at California State University, Los Angeles. As Director of Bands, she conducts the Wind Ensemble, oversees the Symphonic Band and Instrumental Area, and teaches undergraduate and graduate music education courses and conducting. Prior to her current position, she conducted the Wind Ensemble and taught courses in music education for the Conservatory of Music at Brooklyn College of the City University of New York.



Originally from the Pacific Northwest, Dr. Moss began her collegiate music studies at the University of Washington in Seattle, earning a bachelor's degree in Music Education. After teaching middle school band in Chandler, AZ, she returned home to teach band and jazz band at Kellogg Middle School in Shoreline, WA. Dr. Moss served as a teaching assistant with the University bands at the University of Northern Colorado, earning her master's degree in Wind Conducting and the Doctor of Arts in Music Education and Bassoon Performance, studying with Ken Singleton, Dick Mayne, and Charles Hanson.

As a conductor and clinician, Dr. Moss is in high demand across the United States and Canada, and recently travelled to Hong Kong as a guest adjudicator for the Hong Kong International Music Festival. She is also an accomplished bassoonist, actively performing during her degree programs in Washington and Colorado, with the Conservatory Orchestra and other ensembles at Brooklyn College, and for student and faculty recitals at Cal State LA.

Symphonic Band – Sarah McKoin



Dr. Sarah McKoin serves as the Director of Bands, Professor of Music and Chair of the conducting area at Texas Tech University. Her responsibilities include Conductor and Musical Director of the TTU Symphonic Wind Ensemble, administrating the graduate program in wind conducting, pedagogy and wind literature, while overseeing all facets of the university band program which include 5 concert bands, the 400-member Goin' Band and other athletic bands.

Under Dr. McKoin's direction, the Symphonic Wind Ensemble has been featured at the Midwest Clinic in Chicago, the Texas Music Educators Association Conference, and the College Band Director's National Association Southwest regional conferences. Dr. McKoin's ensemble has recorded for Naxos and Albany on world premiere recordings of the wind music of Chen Yi and Narong Prangcharoen and she has been involved in numerous consortiums and premieres of modern wind works. A world premiere recording of Israeli American composer Avner Dorman's wind music is in the early stages of production.

Active as a guest conductor and clinician, Dr. McKoin has traveled extensively throughout the United States and abroad. She has worked in China, Taiwan, Thailand, Canada, and Israel where she served as producer for the world premiere recording of Roberto Sierra's *Fantasia Correliana* with the Castellani-Andriaccio guitar duo and Israeli Chamber Orchestra.

Prior to her appointment at Texas Tech, Professor McKoin was the Director of Bands at the University of Missouri-Kansas City Conservatory of Music and held appointments at the State University of New York at Buffalo and SUNY Fredonia. Additionally, McKoin spent nine summers in residence on the conducting faculty at the Brevard Music Center in Brevard, North Carolina as the Director of the Transylvania Wind Ensemble. and has taught at the Interlochen Arts Academy. She has served as President of the Southwest Division of the College Band Director's National Association as well as President of the Big 12 Band Director's.

Treble Choir – Kristina MacMullen

Prior to her appointment at the University of North Texas College of Music, Kristina served as associate professor of conducting and assistant director of choral activities at The Ohio State University, where she conducted the Symphonic Choir, Women's Glee Club and instructed both undergraduate and graduate students in the areas of conducting and choral pedagogy.

As an active adjudicator and clinician, Dr. MacMullen has conducted All-State and honors choirs throughout the United States. Upcoming engagements involve students in Arizona, Maine, Michigan, South Carolina and Texas. In 2011 she was runner-up in the National American Choral Directors' Association graduate level conducting competition. Other awards include selection as a Fulbright Fellowship Alternate to Slovenia, the Don and Kay Cash Fellowship, and being named a graduate student of distinction for Texas Tech University in the areas of music and humanities and the Sir William Osler Award for Humanism in Medicine from The Ohio State University. Her teaching and conducting is featured on the recording *Conducting-Teaching: Real World Strategies for Success* published by GIA (2009).



Dr. MacMullen earned both the Bachelor of Music Education and Master of Music degrees from Michigan State University. She completed the Doctor of Musical Arts degree at Texas Tech University. Dr. MacMullen has enjoyed a diverse career as a public-school teacher, interacting with students in rural, suburban, and urban settings, elementary through high school. She has presented and co-presented interest sessions at state, regional, national and international conferences.

Mixed Choir - Bruce Rogers



Professor Bruce Rogers is the Director of Choral Activities at Mt. San Antonio College, in Walnut, California. In this role, he oversees the department's various vocal and choral programs, which span the entire spectrum of music – from classical to jazz. He personally directs Mt. San Antonio College's award-winning Chamber Singers and the elite vocal jazz ensemble, Singcopation.

Choirs under his direction have achieved top ranking in national and international competitions throughout the world, including performances in Concert Halls throughout the United States, Canada, Australia, China, Scotland, Wales, England, France, Italy, Germany, Poland, Austria, Switzerland, Bulgaria, the Czech Republic, South Africa, Slovenia, Slovakia and China. Mr. Rogers' choirs have had the honor of performing at eight California State Conventions, twelve American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) Regional and National Conventions as well as performing at three International

Association of Jazz Educators (IAJE) National Conventions and a 2017 performance at the Jazz Education Network (JEN) Conference. In the year 2001, Mr. Rogers became the first choral director in United States history to have two different choirs perform at both the IAJE National Convention and the ACDA National Convention, and in 2005, he achieved this special honor once again. In 2017 he again had two different choirs perform at both the JEN National Conference in New Orleans and the ACDA National Convention in Minneapolis.

Mr. Rogers' guest conducting ventures outside of the United States, includes conducting at the "AMIS International Honor Band and Choral Festival" hosted by the International School at The Hague in the Netherlands, conducting at the "ACCET Choral Conductor's Workshop" held in Melbourne, Australia, guest conducting the music of Franz Joseph Haydn in Vienna and Budapest with a Festival Choir and Orchestra honoring the 200th Anniversary of Haydn's death, and was the headline clinician and guest conductor at the "Australian National Choral Association."

Prior to her appointment at the University of North Texas College of Music, Kristina served as associate professor of conducting and assistant director of choral activities at The Ohio State University, where she conducted the Symphonic Choir, Women's Glee Club and instructed both undergraduate and graduate students in the areas of conducting and choral pedagogy.



Guitar Ensemble – Chuck Hulihan



Chuck Hulihan has enjoyed a career over the past two plus decades as a guitarist, educator, conductor, narrator, arts administrator, and as a classical music radio host. Chuck has directed the guitar program at Glendale Community College since 1999, where he is the Assistant Department Chair for Performing Arts, and in 2015 he was chosen by his peers to receive the GCC Gaucho Globe Award for Supporting Student Success. His work at GCC is highlighted by collaborations with composers whom have written new works for the GCC Guitar Ensembles, including Mark Houghton, Rex Willis, Jan Bartlema, Adrian Andrei, Frank Wallace, Andrew York, Vito Nicola Paradiso, Francisco Munoz, Aramis Silvereke, and Phil Moloso. Since 2000, his students have consistently won the Artists of Promise competition in both solo guitar and instrumental ensemble categories, and in 2014 the GCC Guitar Octet won the Guitar Foundation of America's Ensemble Showcase Competition and went on to perform two world premieres at the 2014 convention.

Chuck's work as a conductor has included over 50 concerts directing the GCC Guitar Ensembles and includes leading large orchestras comprising students from high school, college, and guitar society ensembles. He has led the Arizona Guitar Orchestra (AZGO), a collaboration of musicians from across Arizona, in three statewide tours that featured Shingo Fujii's *Concierto de Los Angeles* with soloist William Kanengiser, Brad Richter's *Once We Moved Like the Wind*, and Andrew York's *By Chants* with the Los Angeles Guitar Quartet. He has been a featured guest conductor with the Clark County School District Honor Ensemble, the Vanguard University Guitar Festival Orchestra, the State College of Florida Guitar Ensemble, The Sonoran Desert Guitars Festival Ensemble, Austin Florida and Virginia All-State Guitar Ensembles. He is the Director of the Guitar Foundation of America's Youth Guitar Orchestra, Community Guitar.

Concert Orchestra – Creston Herron


Creston Herron is the Director of Orchestras at Klein High School in Klein, TX. Prior to Klein, he was the Director of Orchestras at YES Prep Public Schools (Houston, TX). His groups have enjoyed the success of consistent UIL Sweepstakes awards, first division ratings and "best in class" awards at festivals across the country. Under his direction, the Klein chamber orchestra and symphony orchestra have consistently placed in the finals of the prestigious Texas Music Educators Association Honor Orchestra Competition. In 2017, the Klein Chamber Orchestra was recognized as the TMEA String Honor Orchestra. The Klein Chamber and Symphony Orchestras have both been named National Winners of the Mark of Excellence Competition. In 2018, the Klein Chamber Orchestra earned the title of Grand Champions, claiming the coveted Orchestra Cup at the National Orchestra Cup Finals held in New York City. In 2019, the Klein Chamber Orchestra was recognized as Grand Champions of the prestigious ASTA National Orchestra Festival.



Mr. Herron is a graduate of the University of Kansas in Lawrence, Kansas, where he received his bachelor's degree and Rice University, Shepherd School of Music in Houston, TX, where he received his master's degree on scholarship as a Provost Fellow and a Brown Scholar. During the summer seasons, he serves on the AFA Summer Conservatory faculty as a faculty artist.

As a violinist, he has performed with various orchestras, and organizations around the world. His orchestral experience includes performances with Trans-Siberian Orchestra, CCM Spoleto festival in Italy, Pasadena Philharmonic, Galveston Symphony, concertmaster of the Eutiner Festspiele Opera in Eutin, Germany, and Houston Latin Philharmonic.

Symphony Orchestra – Thomas Heuser



American conductor Thomas Heuser has been widely recognized for his stirring leadership and energetic presence both onstage and in the community. Currently serving as Music Director of both the Idaho Falls Symphony and the San Juan Symphony, Thomas lives in Durango, Colorado, with his wife, violinist Lauren Avery, and their son Theodore.

Dr. Heuser was awarded a Fulbright Scholarship for Orchestral Conducting in Germany while serving as a Conducting Fellow with the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra. His Fulbright residency at the Hochschule für Musik und Theater München included orchestral performances in Munich and Berlin and his European operatic debut with Jeunesses Musicales Deutschland.

Moving from Munich to San Francisco, Thomas enjoyed three seasons as the Principal Guest Conductor of the San Francisco Academy Orchestra. He has appeared as guest conductor with the Music in the Mountains Festival Orchestra, Symphony New Hampshire, the Boise Baroque Chamber Orchestra, and the Illinois, Wyoming, Missoula, Flagstaff, Grand Junction, Vallejo, and Portsmouth Symphony Orchestras, among others. Previously he served as assistant conductor for the Pittsburgh New Music Ensemble and the Cincinnati Chamber Orchestra, and he has appeared with orchestras in Canada, Italy, Germany, the Czech Republic, and Estonia.

The son of two molecular biologists at Washington University in St. Louis, Thomas began violin lessons at an early age and studied piano at the St. Louis Symphony Music School. He graduated Phi Beta Kappa from Vassar College with a degree in piano performance and the Francis Walker Prize and earned his Master's in Instrumental Conducting (MM) from Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music. In 2013 he completed his Doctorate in Orchestral Conducting (DMA) from the University of Cincinnati's College-Conservatory of Music. His primary conducting mentors include Paavo Järvi, Marin Alsop, David Robertson, Bruno Weil, Mark Gibson, David Effron, Thomas Baldner, Kevin Noe, Gustav Meier, and Larry Rachleff.



Award Recipients

Ryan Finn, Music educator of the year



Ryan Finn is a native of New Mexico and alumni of the Santa Fe Youth Symphony. He is in his fifth year as band director at Los Alamos Middle School where he conducts the concert and jazz bands. Ryan performs locally with a number of jazz and blues bands on trombone and leads a jazz group that performs many of his original compositions, most of which are in the Caribbean and Latin American styles.


Ryan received a Bachelor of Music Education in 2004 from Loyola University in New Orleans and a Master of Educational Leadership in 2017 from New Mexico Highlands University. He regularly clinics middle school and high school bands throughout the state and his ensembles consistently receive superior ratings at district festivals as well as at the New Mexico State Band Contest.

Before returning to New Mexico in 2012, Ryan taught band, orchestra, and music theory for seven years at the St. Lucia School of Music on the Caribbean island of St. Lucia. He also performed with many well-known Caribbean musicians such as Luther Francois, Barbara Cadet, Alison Marquis, Ronald 'Boo' Hinkson, and Rob 'Zi' Taylor. While in St. Lucia, Ryan arranged and composed in a variety of local folk styles and has a portfolio of over 30 compositions including works for concert bands, jazz bands, musicals and more.

John Batcheller Award – Alexander Flores

Alex is unique in that he has demonstrated the ability to teach both general music and instrumental music and is fluent in English and Spanish. Alex is a native New Mexican having attended the University of New Mexico. As a general music teacher in the Los Lunas Schools and an active member of NMMEA, he has been a confident and effective leader of his colleagues locally and in the Central District. In these roles he has shown imagination, enthusiasm and a true sense of dedication.

Beyond his work at Desert View Elementary, Alex touches many others with his music. He teaches privately, arranges music and performs professionally.



Neil Swapp, Teacher Emeritus of the year



A native of New Mexico, Neil Swapp grew up in Luna and graduated from Reserve High School after which he received a Bachelor of Music Education Degree from New Mexico State University and a Master of Music degree in Trumpet Performance from the St. Louis Conservatory of Music. After the completion of his degree he returned to New Mexico to begin his teaching career.

Neil spent seven years as Director of Bands at Cibola High School in Albuquerque and seventeen years as Director of Bands at Mayfield High School in Las Cruces followed by four years as the Chair of the Music Department at New Mexico School for the Arts. After twenty-eight years in the public schools Neil retired from the classroom.

In retirement he has stayed active in the music world by serving as the NMMEA Executive Director and Webmaster, teaching as an adjunct professor at Western New Mexico University, clinicing bands throughout the state, mentoring younger teachers, guest conducting, and acting as an adjudicator throughout the Southwest. He also serves on numerous state councils and committees including the New Mexico Advisory Council

on Arts Education, New Mexico Activities Association Activities Council, and the NMMEA Music Education Task Force.

Neil has served 2 terms as NMMEA Band Vice President and one term as President and Past President. During his time as president he spearheaded the creation of a new NMMEA website and continues to spearhead technological advancements in the organization.

Neil is also co-founder of the Southwest Music Academy, an organization located in Las Cruces that offers out of school supplemental music instruction to elementary, middle school and high school students. He continues to serve on the board as President.

Jonathan Robak, New and Emerging Educator of the year

Jonathan is in his fifth year as a music educator, having recently graduated from the University of New Mexico with a Bachelor of Music Education. After graduation he taught for four years in the Los Lunas Public Schools and now is band director at Eagle Ridge Middle School in Rio Rancho.

In addition to his success on the podium, Jonathan is a master recruiter and has seen tremendous growth in each program he has been affiliated with. Jonathan is highly sought after as a clinician and guest conductor as well as a private instructor.

Jonathan has also held a number of leadership roles in the state including serving as the NMMEA District 6 Band Vice President.



Dana Sanders, Administrator of the year



Dana Sanders has served as the superintendent of Los Lunas Schools since 2014. She holds a M.A. in Education, with an Emphasis in Teaching from the University of New Mexico (1987), and a B.S. in Education, Elementary Education, with a minor in Health, also from the University of New Mexico (1986).

Ms. Sanders began her career as a teacher in some of the most diverse socio-economic schools in both the Los Lunas School District and surrounding school districts. Ms. Sanders has served in various building administrative capacities at the elementary, intermediate and middle school levels. She was responsible for district wide personnel, athletics, safety and security, as well as leadership development while in her central office positions.

Ms. Sanders' broad experience throughout her thirty-one-year career in education has given her the tools needed to be the first female to lead the State's ninth largest school district, and Valencia County's largest employer. Her love and commitment to the students, staff, and community as a whole, is apparent in all aspects of her leadership. The District's motto 'Every student matters, Every moment counts.' is more than a phrase; it is the foundation of every initiative in the District.

Ms. Sanders believes that in order to be truly effective, it is important to engage and work with surrounding entities and organizations. Kathy Espinoza, Rollie V. Heltman Service Award



Kathy Espinoza is a native New Mexican having grown up in Las Cruces where she graduated from Mayfield High School and attended New Mexico State University. While Kathy isn't a professional musician or educator, she did play clarinet through high school and college and was selected for the 1978 and 1979 All-State.

Kathy has an accounting background which she utilizes in helping to run several family businesses. Kathy entered back into the world of music when she volunteered as the fundraising chair for Mayfield High School, a position she filled well past her daughter's graduation. Kathy now serves as the NMMEA All-State Site Coordinator, a position she has held for five years.

Marianna Gabbi, Hall of Fame Award (posthumously)

Retired music professor, Dr. Marianna Gabbi continued to be active in music and music education until her passing at age 90 with a teaching career spanning more than 45 years.

Born in South Philadelphia in 1928 her love of music grew at an early age as did her talent for playing the violin. She studied at the Philadelphia Settlement Musical Academy and later received a scholarship to the Ecole Normale de Musique in Paris where she studied violin with Yvonne Astruc and Georges Enesco. She lived and studied in cities throughout Europe and later returned to the U.S. to study conducting in Texas under Anshel Brusilow. Dr. Gabbi received a Masters in Music from Southern Methodist University and a Doctor of Musical Arts in violin and conducting from North Texas State University.

Marianna accepted a position at New Mexico State University in 1975 and very quickly demonstrated her vitality and ability to excite others into action that enhanced the artistic quality of life in Southern New Mexico. In addition to the Las Cruces Symphony at NMSU subscription series, she instituted the Youth Concert Series, the Young Artist Competition and the Summer String Workshop. The Las Cruces Symphony Association and its affiliate volunteer organization, the Las Cruces Symphony Guild were also her inspiration. She also brought many notable guest artists to play with the symphony which served to put Las Cruces on the cultural map.

Her talent and fame was international and in 1988 she received an official invitation from China to conduct two orchestras; the Beijing Central and Beijing Conservatory, reaching an enthusiastic audience of over 5,000. In January of 1996, Dr. Gabbi was guest conductor of the Moscow State Symphony Orchestra in Bolshoi Hall, the first woman to conduct that symphony and again in 1998 when she conducted a concert of all-American composers. Dr. Gabbi is in the international Music Museum (London, England) and has performed in Italy, France, Germany, England, Switzerland and Mexico.

The 1998-99 season of the Las Cruces Symphony at NMSU was called, "The Maestra's Farewell," and featured some of the outstanding guest artists she had brought to Las Cruces through the years.

Although retired, she continued to remain active as a violinist, conductor and clinician and in recent years, took up the baton again to conduct the New Horizons Symphony where she worked until her passing. Countless current New Mexico Educators studied under her baton and were influenced by her passion for music and learning.

Dr. Marianna Gabbi enjoyed a long life filled with music and teaching and continued to do both until her passing on September 11, 2018.



Kathleen Hill, Hall of Fame Award



Kathleen Hill is the founder of Central Coast Music Academy (CCMA), a non-profit organization focused on expanding instrumental music for elementary and middle school students in San Luis Obispo County. She recently returned to the Land of Enchantment following five successful years on California's central coast, where she was conductor for "Super Bows!", the entry level string ensemble of the San Luis Obispo Youth Symphony.

She is currently conductor of orchestra at Onate high School and was conductor and instructor at Alma d'Arte Charter High School for the Arts, both in Las Cruces. She was a founding director of Southwest Music Academy (SMA). Both CCMA and SMA offer instrumental programs for students, including summer camps. Kathleen is a frequent guest conductor of several ensembles in southern New Mexico, including the New Horizons Symphony Orchestra, Mesilla Valley Concert Band, and The Brass Factory. Hill received her Bachelor of Music Education degree (viola and piano concentration) and Master of Music degree (instrumental Conducting) from the University of New Mexico. She studied viola with Atar Arad, John DiJanni of the Metropolitan Opera, and Leonard Felberg. She studied conducting with Dr. Jorge Perez-Gomez. In January 2016, Kathleen was the conductor of the 2016 New Mexico Music Educators Association All-State Concert Orchestra.

She directed the orchestra at Mayfield High School in Las Cruces from 1998 until 2011. During her tenure at Mayfield, the orchestra was NMMEA honor orchestra in 2001 and 2004. She also led the orchestra during concert tours in China and England. Prior to teaching at Mayfield, Hill directed orchestras at Cibola High School from 1987 to 1997 and Rio Rancho High School from 1997 to 1998. The Cibola orchestra was recognized as NMMEA All-State Honor Orchestra in 1991 and 1996.

Hill has been a member of the New Mexico Symphony Orchestra, Santa Fe Symphony, the El Paso Symphony, El Paso Opera, Las Cruces Symphony, San Luis Obispo Symphony, Santa Maria Philharmonic, Opera San Luis Obispo, San Luis Obispo Ballet and Santa Barbara's State Street Ballet.

In 2008, Hill was the recipient of the New Mexico Music Educators Association's Music Educator of the Year Award and received the NMMEA Emeritus Teacher Award in 2013.



Rio Rancho Public Schools, Award of Distinction

The arts, including music, are central to the education of every child in Rio Rancho. The district supports full-time music teachers at each of the ten elementary schools (three of which have two music teachers), and every child at that level receives music education classes every year. Each of the RRPS four middle schools has vibrant band, choir, and orchestra classes, with a few of the schools offering exploratory music and guitar. The two comprehensive high schools both boast award-winning programs in band, choir, and orchestra.

The district also supports high school music classes in AP Music Theory, regular music theory, guitar, piano, and music appreciation. Recently the district also added a full-time percussion coordinator position to help support the specific needs of young percussion students. 60 percent of secondary students are enrolled in arts classes, music classes accounting for a large portion of that percentage. RRPS has recently received special commendation from outside groups. The district was designated as a 2019 “Best Community for Music Education” by the National Association of Music Merchants, an honor shared with only 623 other districts in the nation and only four within New Mexico. In addition, RRPS was selected as the first district in New Mexico to form a partnership with the Rockley Family Foundation, which supplies new pianos each year for student and teacher use, free of charge. The recognition of these two entities is indicative of RRPS’s standing as a district that values music.
